

**Dr. Lawrence J. Simon**, was born in Detroit, Michigan, is the second eldest in a family of six siblings. He has a wide-ranging background in psychology receiving his Bachelors degree in psychology at Eastern Michigan University located in Ypsilanti, Michigan and a Masters Degree in Science from Nova Southeastern University located in Fort Lauderdale, Florida.

He received his doctoral degree in clinical psychology with a specialization in forensic psychology from APA accredited Carlos Albizu university located in Miami, Florida. While working to attain his doctoral degree he was employed as a child investigative specialist with the Broward County Sheriff's Office and successfully resolved hundreds of allegations of child physical and sexual abuse, receiving the Grand Cordon Achievement Award for investigations.

Dr. Simon is the author of the well-known book titled "Murder by Numbers: Perspectives on Serial Sexual Violence (2002)." He has been featured on Univision on the subject of mass murder and has appeared on CNN discussing his research and the minds of serial murderers. He has been asked by law enforcement and legal staff to serve as a consultant on numerous cases involving crimes of a sexual and explicit nature.

He has interviewed and conducted research on hundreds of cold-blooded killers and violent sex offenders within the Federal Bureau of Prisons and the Alabama and Florida Department of Corrections. His doctoral research project involved investigating personality differences and specific methodologies of weapons selection conducive to multiple homicides. His most recent research endeavor has involved investigating psychological motivations of serial sexual homicide. He has also had the rare opportunity of interviewing dangerous inmates on Florida's death row.
