**RE:** Mapping Program Updates to Allow **SB 5097 Reporting**

We are pleased to announce that the state school mapping system has been upgraded to allow users to report SB 5097 information directly to WASPC. The mapping system, formally known as the Critical Incident Planning and Mapping System (CIPMS), and commonly referred to as **Rapid Responder**, was authorized in 2003 by RCW 36.28A.060.

We are also happy to announce that we are on schedule to complete the mapping of all public schools (K12) in the state by December 2008. Approximately 200 schools remain to be added to the state school mapping system.

Attached to this letter are two important documents. These documents can also be accessed on the Internet at the URL's listed. As they are modified, the latest version will be available at these sites.

- A document titled **How to Report to WASPC**. This document includes the full text of RCW 28A.320.125, as modified by SB 5097 in 2007. Inserted at appropriate places within the text are the detailed instructions on how to enter the relevant information into Rapid Responder. This entry is accomplished by trained "system administrators" at each district or school. No other reporting to WASPC is required; the updating of school plans and data and the entry of this data constitutes the reporting. You may also find this document at
