“TWO FOR HANGING”

“Two For Hanging” is a new limited edition print of an original watercolor by award-winning artist Daniel L. Mihalko. The painting depicts the 1880's arrest of two murderers by sheriffs from the eastern countries of the State of Washington.

Eli Cummings, an Oregon Railroad warehouseman, was brutally murdered with an axe on July 26, 1882 in Columbia County Washington, Sheriff Ed Wilson of Garfield County and Deputy Sheriff Cavanaugh of Columbia County tracked down the two murderers, James McPherson and Ezra Snoderly, in the spring of 1883 and arrested them. They were tried and convicted and sentenced to hang. Vigilantes broke into the jail and lynched McPherson; Snoderly was hanged on August 7, 1883.

This full-color limited edition print of 950 is printed on top quality archival paper and is signed and numbered by the artist. Image size of the print is 16 by 23 inches. These commemorative prints are now available for only \$50, plus \$5 for handling and postage.
