Participation Options for Tribal Law Enforcement Agencies

What is NIBRS?

NIBRS is a method of submitting Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) to the FBI

NIBRS replaces the Summary Reporting System (SRS) method

Because it is incident-based, NIBRS collects more details than SRS

There is no hierarchy rule in NIBRS – up to ten (10) offenses per incident are reported

Why report via NIBRS?

- The FBI will not accept SRS submissions beginning January 1, 2021
- UCR submission is a requirement for some federal grants - although it will not immediately affect grant applications, lapses in submission will affect eligibility in the future
- NIBRS submission is electronic, easier, and faster

What are the submission options?

Option 1: NIBRS data can be submitted to the FBI via the State UCR Program or Option 2: Tribal agencies can enter directly to the FBI website application

Sy either submission method, the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) states they will receive tribal law enforcement UCR from the FBI

Option 1: Submission through the State UCR Program:

If your agency has a NIBRS-compliant records management system (RMS), you can submit a monthly batch file

If you do not have an RMS, you can enter incidents directly to the state NIBRS database via a website

Option 2: Direct submission to the FBI UCR Program:

You must have an account with the Law Enforcement Enterprise Portal (LEEP)

Through LEEP, you enroll in direct NIBRS submission via the NIBRS Data Collection Application (DCA)
