
Guidelines for the NIBRS Summary of Offenses Report from COPLINK NIBRS

The following procedures are for extracting NIBRS data from the state repository, COPLINK NIBRS. You must be an employee of a contributing law enforcement agency and have a user profile to access this database.


1. On the COPLINK NIBRS homepage, click on the "Statistics and Reports" link under the "Crime Statistics" heading.




2. A new window will open with tabs for various reports: Arrest, Domestic Violence, Hate Crime, Homicide Offenses, Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted (LEOKA), Offender, Offense, Property, and Victim.




3. To produce a Summary of Offense report, click on the "Offense" tab.




- 4. On the "Offense" screen, choose the report parameters, such as:
 - a) Agency
 - b) Year
 - c) Month(s) for the report




To choose an agency, use the drop down list (only one agency can be chosen):



Multiple months and years can be chosen by holding down the shift key while clicking on the months and/or years; *however*, this request will combine the statistics into one report.



5. After choosing an agency, year, and month for the report data, click on "Generate Report":



6. The report will open in another window with options to Print, Download in HTML, Download in CSV, or Close (the window); the report headings indicate the agency, year, and month








8. At the bottom of the page, there are options for data visualization in charts.
