WHAT IS THE 24/7 SOBRIETY PROGRAM?	The 24/7 sobriety program is a twenty-four hour, seven day a week monitoring program. Participants submit to testing to determine the presence of alcohol and/or drugs.
WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?	As a participant you will report to the testing facility twice each day, including weekends and holidays. Once during a designated testing period in the morning and once during a designated testing period in the evening. During that time, you will take a portable breath test to determine if you have consumed alcohol. You may also be required to take a random drug test.

WHERE IS THE TESTING FACILITY?	Programs are established in Clallam County (testing at Clallam County Jail) and the City of Centralia (testing at the Centralia Police Department).
WHAT DOES IT COST?	You will be required to pay a \$30 enrollment fee. The cost for portable breath tests is \$2/test. Drug test fees are \$10/test.
WHY SHOULD I DO THIS?	Depending on your situation, the 24/7 Sobriety Program may be used to decrease jail time, decrease the length of license suspension, and/or in lieu of pretrial ignition interlock.
